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- Handwashing sinks have been installed in the cafeteria and throughout the campus.
 - Hand Sanitizer stations are available throughout the campus.
 - Educational signage is posted throughout the campus on COVID-19 symptoms, the spread of germs and handwashing.
 - Needlepoint bipolar ionization systems have been installed in our schools.
- Ionization systems are designed to kill pathogens to mitigate the spread of viruses and bacteria. This is done by the ions stealing the hydrogen from the pathogens, leaving them to die and leaving the school with clean and healthy indoor air. This ionization system serves as a safety and ventilation measure aimed at mitigating the spread of coronavirus in our schools.

Public input was invited at the LEAs governing Board Meeting on 9.13.2023 during Call to the audience and under Action Items. A motion was accepted in regards to the updated Mitigation Plan that was adopted the fall of 2020-2021 (Safe Return to In-Person Instruction Plan) Updates included information that will be posted on the school website. The plan includes: universal and correct wearing of masks, handwashing and respiratory etiquette, cleaning facilities, improved ventilation and facilities to allow for physical distancing, contact tracing, screening and quarantining, efforts to provide vaccinations, and coordination with state and local health officials. The plan also outlines continuity of services in terms of academic needs; social, emotional, and mental needs; SEL professional development; and other needs, such as food services and technology. The plan is aligned to CDC, Local Pima County Health Department and Arizona State Law.
